#### ONE DAY TALK/WORKSHOP 'Picasso in Context' - Tutor: SALLY RIDOUT

Report by Nigel Stevenson

We very much looked forward to Sally's workshop, *Picasso in Context*', particularly as we had recently visited the Picasso museum in Barcelona. The workshop was very timely: we were eager to explore some historical context and to try out some new techniques. So how to summarise one of the icons of the 20th century, an artist who was prolific in painting, sculpture, printing, ceramics, theatre design and who produced over 20,000 works of art and 100,000 prints in his lifetime, all in 91 years. A daunting task.

Sally described and illustrated some of the influences in Picasso's life, his upbringing, women in his life, loves and losses, the effect of 2 world wars, other renowned French and Catalan artists, the ballet, circus harlequins, his passions and pet hates etc, portrayed through paintings such as Les Demoiselles d'Avignon (influence of African art), Guernica (effect of the Spanish civil war, pre WW2), 3 Musicians (cubism). As a group, we discussed various Picasso works, from the weird and wonderful, the sublime and surreal, sometimes the erotic and sometimes dark. Overall, Sally's presentation was very interesting and thought provoking and gave us an insight into finding out more.

In the afternoon there was a chance for hands-on drawing and painting such as: drawing from memory, illustrating 'Picasso hands', a still life from different viewpoints, and some freestyle painting (creating our own form of abstract or Picasso-esque art). Many thanks, Sally for such an informative and enjoyable day and for your guidance, visual aids, helpful material and reference books. Such a busy day!

#### **Painting Days**

The year's painting days concluded with a visit to Sherborne where BAS member Miranda Pender, a resident of the town, was there to meet and greet. The year began in May at Lovington Mill, the home of former BAS committee member Fletcher Robinson, a venue which saw the highest attendance of the year. This was followed in June at Pitcombe Farmhouse, the home of Merida Drysdale and her delightful garden, and soon after in June the venue was Wyke Manor at Wyke Champflower, an interesting manor house with the parish church of The Holy Trinity attached, hosted by the owner Elizabeth Winkley. A painting day at Batcombe in July was poorly attended due to the poor weather, but later that month in better weather saw an improved attendance at the unusual venue of Sexey's Hospital in Bruton at the kind permission of the Trustees. Still in July, Count Charles and Countess Carolyn de Salis were our hosts at their Georgian home Yarlington House, and at the start of August the venue was the East Somerset Heritage Railway at Cranmore where only four artists turned up, perhaps due to the lack of a fine old house and pretty gardens.

Unfortunately this was my last year as Painting Day Organiser as I will be leaving the committee of the Bruton Art Society. The committee is therefore looking for a new member to succeed me so it is hoped that out of a membership of well over 300 one of you will come forward.



He is continuing his theme of painting temperate rainforests from sketches he made while travelling around the country visiting these romantically misty woodlands. Rainforests, mostly made up of gnarly oaks covered in mosses, liverworts, lichen and polypody ferns used to cover 20% of our country but now, sadly, make up less than 1%. They thrive in damp conditions, not ideal for plein air watercolour painting, so he is working mainly from his studio in Shaftesbury.


